Dear Pastors and Praying Friends,

It is so encouraging to know we serve a God Who is both never taken by surprise and is also gracious and merciful to us when we go through difficult seasons of life. So has it been for our family over the last few weeks with our minivan. Many of you are aware from last month's prayer letter that we struck a boulder rock while in Colorado, which did quite a bit of damage in the undercarriage of the vehicle. After a headache of dealing with insurance and having the van taken out of the shop to be put right back in the shop to repair additional issues, we finally got the van back after close to a month without it. Earlier this week, we were driving the van to our destination in Wisconsin, when we lost control of the vehicle, hitting a concrete bridge ambutment. We praise the Lord no one was hurt and that His hand of protection was evident at that moment. The reason why our vehicle swerved off the road was because our vehicle's subframe had somehow broken, causing the rear passenger tire to separate from the main body of the vehicle. It seems certain that our insurance is not willing to cover expenses for the subframe, and only to the body work needed from hitting the concrete barrier. While we are contesting this, it seems unlikely that our insurance will change. Our van is considered totaled, which has not only left us without a vehicle, but also without the financial help of insurance to purchase a new vehicle. Of course, we do not know why these things happen; but we do know that if this is from the attacks of Satan, that not only has the Lord allowed it, but what Satan means for evil "God meant it unto good." We also know that the Lord many times brings these events into our lives to bring us closer to Him, while He purges us and seeks to grow us. We have seen these faithful principles of Scripture played out through this entire season of life. While in Colorado, on the way to pick up a rental car, I had the privilege of leading my Uber driver, Norman, to the Lord! This has brought a deeper understanding to what the Lord is doing through this. Please pray for Norman that he will grow and get involved in a local church. Another amazing development by the grace of God has been a dear couple in Wisconsin whose church we were in for a Wednesday night service feel led of the Lord to give us their van! I was personally encouraged and blessed by a number of local supporting pastors who took the time to come support me during the process. My former Pastor Wade Cash and my current Pastor Michaiah Stanley both brought convicting, powerful charges in my ordination service. It is an honor to have these men in the ministry continue to make an impact in my life.
